What is phonics?

• "Phonics is simply the system of relationships between letters and sounds in language." (PBS Parents)

How can I help my child develop phonics skills?

- read environmental print (street signs, product labels, store names, candy wrappers, etc.) wherever you go
- use magnetic letters or letter cards to manipulate letters and make words
- cut labels off household items (cereal boxes, Kleenex, soup labels, etc.) and:
 - o sort them by first letter
 - o put them in alphabetical order
 - o look for blends & digraphs
 - o glue them in a book that your child can then read
- write letters and words in shaving cream
- play games such as Scrabble Junior and Boggle Junior
- READ, READ, READ expose your child to quality literature!
